In Grasshoppers children are expected to complete 3 task based homework tasks throughout each term. Children are encouraged to do this in order to develop their independent learning.

Look at the options below and choose 3 tasks to complete this term. Once you have completed them, bring them in to class for us to see!

<u>The Cheddar Man</u> Investigate The Cheddar Man. Write a fact file or booklet about him, focusing on a number of interesting facts you have found out.	<u>Iron Age Buildings</u> Investigate what Iron Age building were like. Explain what they looked like, how they were made and used. This can be through writing or in model form.	<u>Book Review</u> Write a book review comparing two books you have read. How were the similar and how were they different? What did you like and dislike about them?
<u>London Tourist Attractions</u> Select 3 tourist attractions in London to write about. Give information about what they are like, what you can see there and other interesting facts about them.	<u>Palaeolithic, Mesolithic or Neolithic</u> Create a quiz about the Stone Age, thinking about the different periods. Make up at least 20 questions and an answer sheet too.	<u>Science Experiment</u> Research and carry out an experiment into light. You can choose your own experiment by researching, then write a brief set of instructions and a conclusion to explain your findings.
<u>Photograph portfolio</u> Create a portfolio of 5 pictures you have taken yourself, explain why you have taken them, what you like about them and how you would make them even better if you took them again.	<u>PowerPoint</u> Choose a topic you are passionate about, for example a sport, animal, place etc... Create a PowerPoint at least 5 slides long, with accompanying information about your topic. Rehearse this so it can be presented to the rest of the class.	<u>King Charles</u> Write a persuasive letter to King Charles with suggestions on how to make the UK a better place to live. Give him some ideas and back them up with your own opinions. Follow the correct format of a letter.
