

Grasshopper's homework grid

In Grasshoppers children are expected to complete 3 task-based homework tasks through each half term. Children are encouraged to do this in order to develop their independent learning.

Look at the options below and choose 3 tasks to complete this half term and 3 next half term. Once you have completed them, bring them in to class for us to see!

<u>Photograph portfolio</u> Create a portfolio of 5 pictures you have taken yourself, explain why you have taken them, what you like about them and how you would make them even better if you took them again.	<u>Our Local Area</u> Select a local town or village. Do your own research into that area, either focusing on it as a whole or selecting a certain part of the town/ village or building. Create a fact file, ensuring you use both writing and diagrams/ pictures to illustrate your ideas.	<u>Book Review</u> Write a book review comparing two books you have read. How were they similar and how were they different? What did you like and dislike about them?
<u>London Tourist Attractions</u> Select 3 tourist attractions in London to write about. Give information about what they are like, what you can see there and other interesting facts about them.	<u>Palaeolithic, Mesolithic or Neolithic</u> Create a quiz about the Stone Age, thinking about the different periods. Make up at least 20 questions and an answer sheet too.	<u>Science Experiment</u> Research and carry out an experiment into light. You can choose your own experiment by researching, then write a brief set of instructions and a conclusion to explain your findings.
<u>UK songs</u> Do some research into some traditional English songs, these can be modern or historic. Think about the lyrics and the tune. Either practice the song to perform to the class, or create a presentation about it, focusing on areas like, what you like/don't like, its history, any meanings or historical relevance.	<u>PowerPoint</u> Choose a topic you are passionate about, for example a sport, animal, place etc... Create a PowerPoint at least 5 slides long, with accompanying information about your topic. Rehearse this so it can be presented to the rest of the class.	<u>King Charles</u> Write a persuasive letter to King Charles with suggestions on how to make the UK a better place to live. Give him some ideas and back them up with your own opinions. Follow the correct format of a letter.
