

Please choose 3 topic-based pieces of homework to be completed and handed in by the end of term. Use your imagination and creativity, but remember to include wonderful writing, perfect punctuation, super spelling and lovely letter formation.

<p><u>Influential Person</u> Write a fact file about someone who has made a difference/who has been influential in making a positive change to humanity.</p> <p><u>Creative Writing</u> Create a story about a character that has arrived on Earth from another planet.</p>	<p><u>Anglo-Saxon</u> Investigate what Anglo-Saxon buildings were like. Explain what they looked like, how they were made and used. This can be through writing, or you might even want to make a model of one!</p> <p><u>Local History</u> Create a leaflet about your local area.</p>	<p><u>Book Review</u> Write a book review about the best book that you have ever read in your life...ever! Rather than using the template in the book review folder, make this one as colourful and creative as you possibly can with loads of persuasive writing!</p>
<p><u>North American Tourist Attractions</u> Select 3 tourist attractions in North America to write about. Give information about what they are like, what you can see there and other interesting facts about them. These should be different to the ones done in class.</p>	<p><u>Online Safety</u> Create a quiz about how to stay safe online. Make up at least 20 questions and an answer sheet too.</p>	<p><u>Science Experiment</u> Research and carry out an experiment into states of matter and changing state. You can choose your own experiment by researching, then write a brief set of instructions and a conclusion to explain your findings.</p> <p><u>Earth and Space</u> Try to build a Model Solar System. Can you research about the different planets in our Solar System too.</p>
<p><u>Photograph portfolio</u> Create a portfolio of 5 pictures you have taken yourself, explain why you have taken them, what you like about them and how you would make them even better if you took them again.</p>	<p><u>PowerPoint</u> Choose a topic you are passionate about, for example a sport, animal, place etc... Create a PowerPoint at least 5 slides long, with accompanying information about your topic. Rehearse this so it can be presented to the rest of the class.</p>	<p><u>King Charles</u> Write a letter to King Charles telling him all about someone in your life who has had a huge, positive impact on your life. It could be a family member, a sports coach, even a teacher! Follow the correct format of a letter. I will post it for you and I am quite sure that you will get a reply!</p>
